Online reviews revealed that the first mechanic had been fleecing people for years! It turns out that the car only needed transmission fluid—a simple \$10 fix. It was a close call for Glenn. Looking for help in the wrong places can cost any of us big time!

Of course, there are no references to cars or transmissions in the Bible, but we know that people have been looking to unreliable sources of help since the beginning of time. It all started in the Garden of Eden. Satan had a plan to trick God's human creatures into trusting him, and it worked perfectly. Eve took the fruit and Adam followed suit. He looked to Eve, relying on her confidence in the serpent's lie. Paradise was lost in the blink of an eye. We see this same mistake repeated throughout the Bible. King David relied on his own clever tricks to fix his problems, going so far as to plan a murder to cover up his adultery. Judas trusted in the power of money and betrayed his Savior for thirty silver coins. The apostle Paul-who acted as the worst of the worst when he was still known as Saul-tried to find favor with God by murdering those who followed Jesus. All of these men were looking for help, for a fix, for something to make their lives better. They trusted Satan's lies and gave in to his temptations. Where do you turn when you're in trouble? When you're in a tight spot and need wisdom, when you're just tired of the daily-ness of daily life, when you have a mess on your hands and can't figure out how to leave it behind, where do you go for help? Where do you place your trust? Our culture tells us how real men are supposed to behave. A few drinks or a few pills will take the edge off. A me-first attitude will smooth the way to a smart decision. It may not feel quite right at first but, after all, that's just how men are supposed to behave. You may already know that fixes like these fall short. Sooner or later, everyone who tries them ends up sitting beside Adam, beside David, beside Paul-quilty as charged and facing unthinkable consequences. The fact is that every man on this earth has fallen. Every one of us has at one time or another believed the lies of the devil, turned away from our only true Helper, and found ourselves stuck and sinking more deeply into the pit of sin. Every man-but One.

Our Savior, Jesus Christ was born to be your fix, your one, true source of renewal and hope. Every step of his life was devoted to obeying our heavenly Father. (Read John 4:34.) Jesus never lost focus. He came to live a perfect life in our place, and that life ended as he hung on the cross, dying in payment for our sins. On Calvary's cross, we find the one-the only-source of help we will ever need. Jesus' death and resurrection makes us right with God again. When we come to him with our sins, he forgives us and renews our spirits. His gifts of grace and mercy provide the strength we need to keep on walking through this life as his chosen people, his son and heirs. They that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint. Isaiah 40:31 Notice the power of that promise! Not might. Not maybe. Those who wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength. Minute by minute. Hour by hour. Day by day. Renewed strength is ours. We will run-read Psalm 119:32. We will walk and keep on walking-read Psalm 86:11. And as we mount up on eagles' wings, we join the psalmist, saying in confidence-read Psalm 18:2.

But Jesus' love and forgiveness have no bounds. His sacrifice on the cross covers every sin and fathers who depend on Jesus know that there is no better place, no other place, to find unending strength and constant renewal for life. To all the men-fathers, grandfathers, uncles, brothers, coaches, and other father figures-we thank you for all of the help you provide. Most of all, we thank you for pointing all of us, especially your children and your families to Jesus.






Pentecost

The season of Pentecost is the longest of the church year seasons. It begins after the seventh Sunday of Easter and ends with the first Sunday of Advent. The word "Pentecost" means "fiftieth day." For the Jews, Pentecost was the Feast of the Weeks. It 💈 celebrated the end of the grain harvest. The celebration of Pentecost today recalls when the Holy Spirit ascended on the heads of the disciples in the form of tongues of fire. All the people gathered from many countries heard the word of God in their own language. Many believed and were baptized. Through the centuries it became the day the many baptisms took place. Those who were going to be baptized put on white garments. The day became known as Whitsunday, which means White Sunday due to the white garments that those being baptized wore.

Trinity Sunday

In the church year, Trinity Sunday is the next Sunday after Pentecost. Most of the rest of the church year focuses on the events surrounding Jesus Christ. Trinity focuses on a doctrine of the church. It was originally known as the Festival of the Holy Trinity. On a non -communion Sunday, the Apostle's Creed is confessed. On communion Sundays, the Nicene Creed is confessed. But on Trinity Sunday, it is suggested that the Athanasian 3 Creed is confessed, as it is more in depth in explaining the trinity.





STEWARDSHIP: JUNE 2019

Some disciples of John the Baptist were questioning him about the baptism and preaching of Jesus. Many disciples were going to Jesus instead of John the Baptist.

John the Baptist answers: "A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven" (John 3:27).

John the Baptist says this to show that Jesus, His teaching, and His baptism are from heaven. God provides everything we have in body and soul.

We are taught this in the meaning of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism.

In the First Article of the Creed, we learn that God has made us and everything in the universe.

"He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

In the Second Article of the Creed, we learn that God sent His Son, Jesus, to humble Himself by taking the form of a servant.

In so doing, He "has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity."

In the Third Article of the Creed, we learn that the fruits of what Jesus Christ, the Son of God, did are given to us through the work of the Holy Spirit in the Church.

"That I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ."

Indeed, "a person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven."

But how easy is this for us to forget? How easy is it for us to think that what we have in life is because we have earned it?

How easy is it for us to forget that all our skills - the abilities of our hands and minds, the ethic to work diligently, and the desire to improve – is given to us from heaven, just as John the Baptist said?

How easy is it for us to forget that it is Christ alone, and the work of the Holy Spirit, that reveals His salvation to us, delivers it to us, and that none of this is our doing?

Sure, we have responsibility for coming to church, for delving into God's Holy Word, and for praying without ceasing.

But even these responsibilities are given to us from heaven. These duties are not earned; they are given in response to what He has accomplished for us.

Everything we have, and everything we are – in both body and soul – are gifts from God in heaven.

Let us then respond in thanksgiving and give back to Him as He asks – with a first-fruits, generous proportion offering of what He has given to us.


